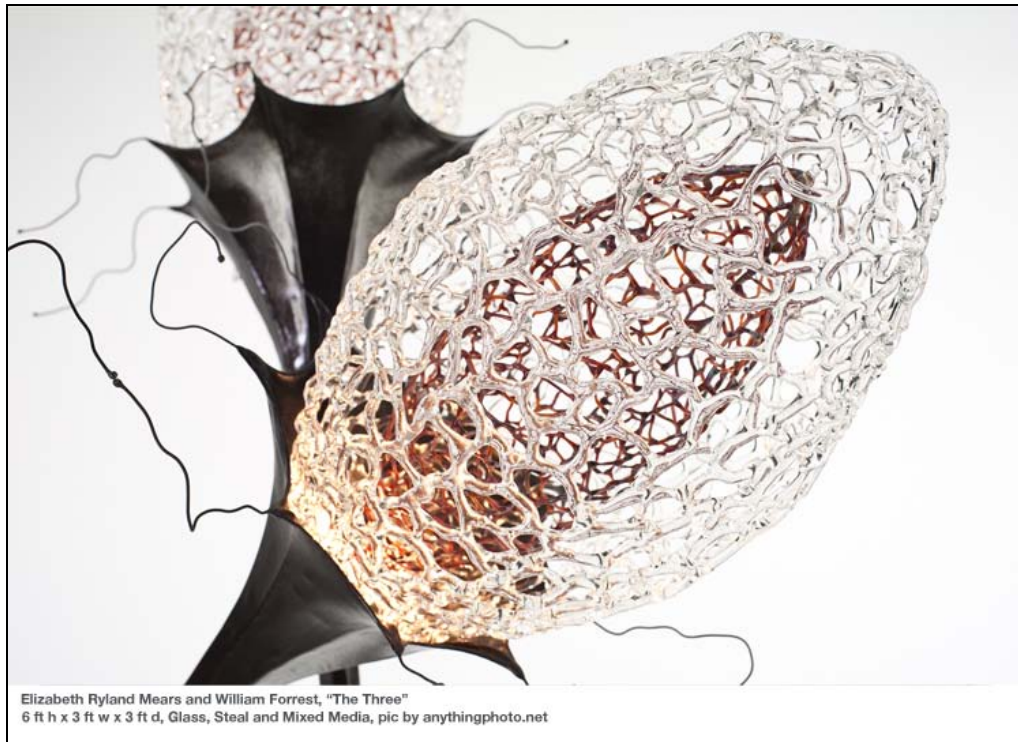

Long View Gallery additionally offers design consultations to both individual and corporate clients, as well as an in-house custom framing service.
